Our petition is supported by the Frauensession

We are very happy to announce that our proposal to add the demand for a nation-wide office for complaints about sexual harassment and violence has been accepted into the petition 'Equality policy standards for university funding and the allocation of third-party funding' during the <u>Frauensession</u> on October 29 and 30, 2021! Also included are the following demands:

- standardized and transparent processes to deal with misconduct as an institution
- standards for transparent allocation of resources within the institution based on measurable criteria
- standards to combat discrimination, abuse of power and sexual harassment involving minorities through quantitative and qualitative surveys

These demands are part of our letter <u>Addressing gender inequality in academia in Switzerland</u> and will be brought to the chambers of the Swiss parliament. You can still sign our letter to support this cause! See the full list of 23 proposals <u>here</u> (in German).

Acoso #MeToo in Spanish Science is a book (in Spanish) about sexual harassment and sex-based discrimination in universities and public research institutions.

In 2017, the allegations against the Hollywood productor, Harvey Weinstein, sparked the #MeToo movement. Since then, many inappropriate behaviors have been reported creating awareness of a situation that had been hidden for decades. In this book, Angela Bernardo Álvarez combines interviews and analyses to provide an up-to-date overview about questions such as: What defines those types of misbehaviors? How are they regulated? What is known about sexual stalkers? What difficulties are faced by people having these problems? What is the role of the institutions to prevent and stop this scourge?
